Philippines:

This year our team, led by our Director of Operations Campbell Kelley, went on a relief mission to our partners in the Philippines where we helped provide over \$5,000,000 of medical aid! He also worked at the feeding program in the smoky mountain community in Manila where thousands of chil-

dren go hungry, hunt for garbage all day to sell for the price of a meal and are without any education.

"When we think of poverty, hunger and abuse, normally we think of Africa, where we also provide support, but the fact is that tens of thousands of children are sexually trafficked here in the Philippines alone. And thousands of children live off of one meal a day that might cost around eleven cents. We at ACF are making a difference in these children's lives and I'm proud to be a part of our team." -Campbell Kelley, Director of Operations

Uganda:
